Greetings...

The end of another school year is upon us and the Festival of Angels announces the start of summer vacation (at least for the students). It's been a good year here at Holy Angels School. We completed our work on the once-every-seven-years accreditation team visit. Although the team was thoroughly impressed with our school, we've made some plans for improvements in order to make our school even better. I'll be putting some details on those plans over the summer.

Our associate pastor Fr. Nate has been assigned to lead the faith community at Cabrini and we'll miss his presence here at HAS. Fr. Jerry continues to provide us with wisdom, inspiration and leadership.

The Stehling Project has provided some wonderful opportunities at Holy Angels over the past several years. The funding this year has allowed our students to experience the Lynden Sculpture Garden (formerly known as the private Bradley Sculpture Garden) in a very unique way. A docent spent time with each of the grades here at school presenting information about a variety of art forms including sculpture and abstract art. This was followed by an opportunity for students to tour the sculpture garden and then have studio time at LSG. Unfortunately, the terrible spring weather dampened the experience for some of the classes (there was one glorious sun-filled day!).

As I've been reading through this year's parent survey, I can't help but reflect on the importance of faith in the life of our community. Our parents greatly value the day-to-day living of our Gospel calling. In addition, it's remarkable how many parents appreciate the exposure to world languages which is unique to our school. One can't help but wonder about what the global future will be for our present students. The Stehling Project is also supporting the Chinese curriculum.

Finally, we're looking into expanding the use of technology as an educational tool. Although there are SMARTBoards in every instructional area (thanks to the Stehling Project), the use of iPads for individualizing instruction has some additional potential for our Resource Learning Centers. The verdict is still out on replacing textbooks with iPads so we're being a bit cautious in that area, but for small groups working with the RLC staff, there are many great applications.

The face of education keeps changing. The concern most mentioned by parents is affordability which then relates to enrollment and class sizes. We continue to look for ways to be as cost-effective as possible while meeting the needs of all who want to enroll in our school. We're graduating a small class of 27 students this year. However, our parish census indicates that there is the likelihood of small classes entering our school over the next few years. In all, we have been blessed by a supportive community and we're extremely grateful!



Those who have read my letters in the past are probably waiting for the latest family info so here it is...Linda and I are continuing to re-do our house. After the siding and windows, we've moved to the inside where second floor wallpaper and plaster is being replaced by drywall and "Santa Fe knockdown" (I've had lots of fun with that!). We're going to keep progressing through the house, including the kitchen (which was designed by HA students in one of my math classes...anyone remember whose plan was used?). I'm playing softball again after a year off for shoulder surgery and we've got a Cousins Subs team...it actually has eight cousins and three uncles (and a few subs) on the team and we really are sponsored by Cousins Subs! I get to still play ball with Matt, Luke and John. Mark, however, is busy up in Green Bay building a new home. In July, the whole gang (all 15 of us) will be heading to Rocky Mountain National Park for some camping, hiking and just having fun together!

Unless I fall off a mountaintop somewhere, I look forward to another school year in fall and the opportunity to share in the journey of growth with another 350 students and a terrific staff! Enjoy your summer!

Chess Champs

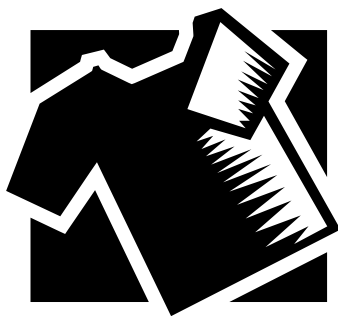
